Job Description/Responsibilities:

This position includes teaching Chemistry, Advanced Chemistry, Integrated Physics and Chemistry (IPC), Biology, and Advanced Biology. Additional teaching assignments may be made based on the successful candidate's licensure, experience, interest, or school need.

The ideal candidate presents classes clearly and effectively. He or she builds upon interest, abilities, and previous learning experiences of the students. The science teacher communicates learning objectives clearly to students, addressing various student learning by utilizing multi-sensory teaching strategies.

This position requires the ability to motivate students. This includes:

Challenging students and enthusiastically communicating expectations and purposes for learning

Giving constructive feedback to students

Eliciting and responding to student questions
