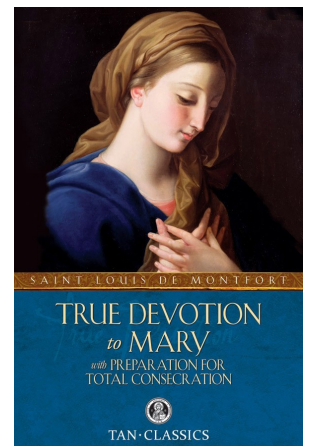
[True Devotion to Mary](#), by Saint Louis de Montfort

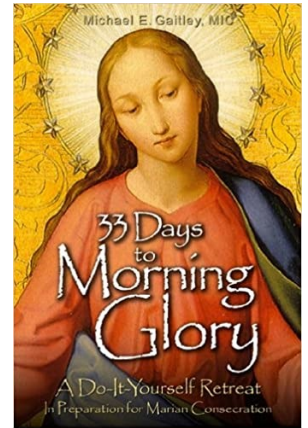

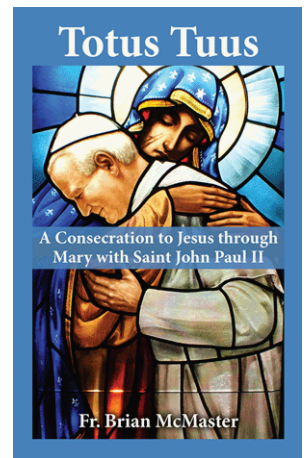

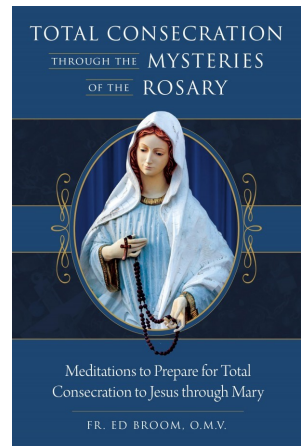

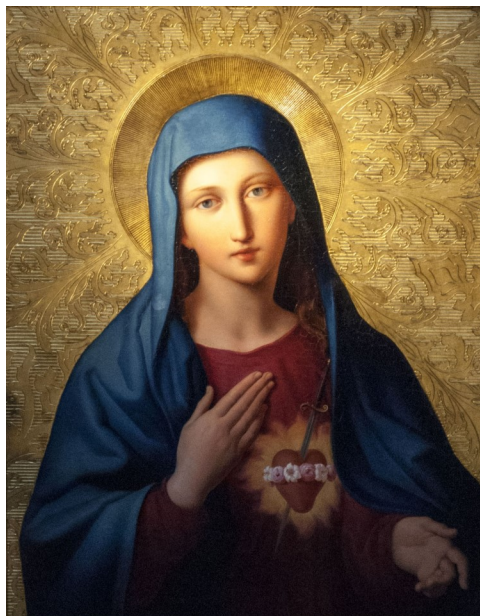
