

Greetings in Our Lord, Jesus Christ.

I am grateful for the opportunity to write the people of our Diocese and express my thanks for the support of so many of you for the Diocese of Evansville's Catholic Parishes Campaign, This annual appeal provides the majority of the funding for the pastoral and ministerial outreach of the Diocese.

While our parishes are

the local communities where the Sacraments are celebrated, the faith is shared, and various services are offered, the Diocese provides the framework and resources that allow our parishes to bring these ministries to parishioners. Much of this support takes place in the background of daily parish life, but the resources and expertise offered by Diocesan offices are vital to supporting the efforts of our parishes and schools.

One example of this collaboration is the Diocesan Eucharistic Renewal, which we began on the Solemnity of Corpus Christi. The purpose of this renewal is to deepen parishioners' understanding of the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist, to invite inactive Catholics back to Mass, to encourage Catholics to share their faith and to help our people recognize how the Eucharist should impact their daily lives. Our Office of Catechesis is directing this important effort with other diocesan offices and is providing resources for parishes and schools that this renewal might bear much fruit in lives of Catholics in our 12 counties.

This kind of collaboration would not be possible without the financial support of parishioners from every parish. Your gift today ensures that we can continue this and many other ministries to help build up the Kingdom of God in Southwest Indiana.

Unlike the regular Sunday collection that goes towards taking care of the needs of your parish, the diocese only takes this one opportunity each year to ask for your financial support. The **Catholic Parishes Campaign** serves all those in the local Church, which is the Diocese of Evansville. Our local Church is:

- 5,010 square miles in size
- 72,206 registered Catholics out of a total population 511,728
- 45 parishes
- 36 diocesan priests of our diocese active in our diocese plus 1 diocesan priest working outside of our diocese
- · 30 retired priests, sick or absent
- 5 religious priests resident in our diocese +3 extern priests
- 207 religious sisters
- 58 permanent deacons
- 12 seminarians
- · 2 Catholic hospitals
- 4 Catholic high schools with 1,361 students enrolled
- 22 Catholic elementary schools with 4,994 students enrolled

In addition, in the last year there were:

- 714 infant baptisms (infants up to age 7)
- 61 minor baptisms (those between ages 7 and 17)
- 46 adult baptisms (18 and over)
- 78 received into Full Communion
- 281 marriages
- · 817 deaths

(46.63%) The Office of Vocations guides the formation of our priests, while the offices of Worship, Tribunal, and the Chancellor all uphold our priests as they bring the Lord to their parishioners. "The Diocese has 11 seminarians, and the House of Discernment has four residents. These 15 men come from 12 different parishes across the Diocese. The Savio community has grown to nearly 200 teenage young men from more than half of the parishes in our 12 counties in the past three years."
